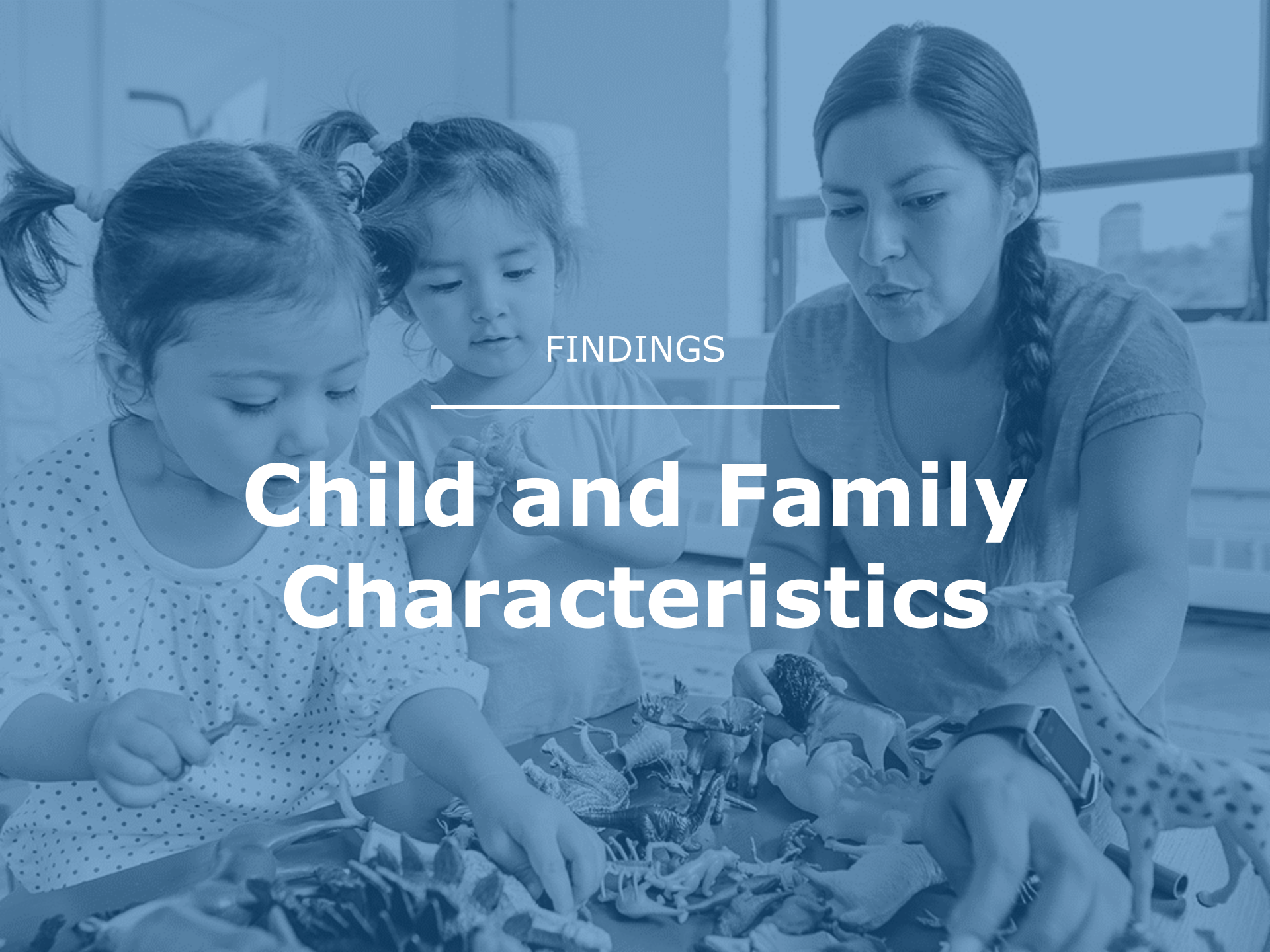


Impact of COVID-19 on child care providers

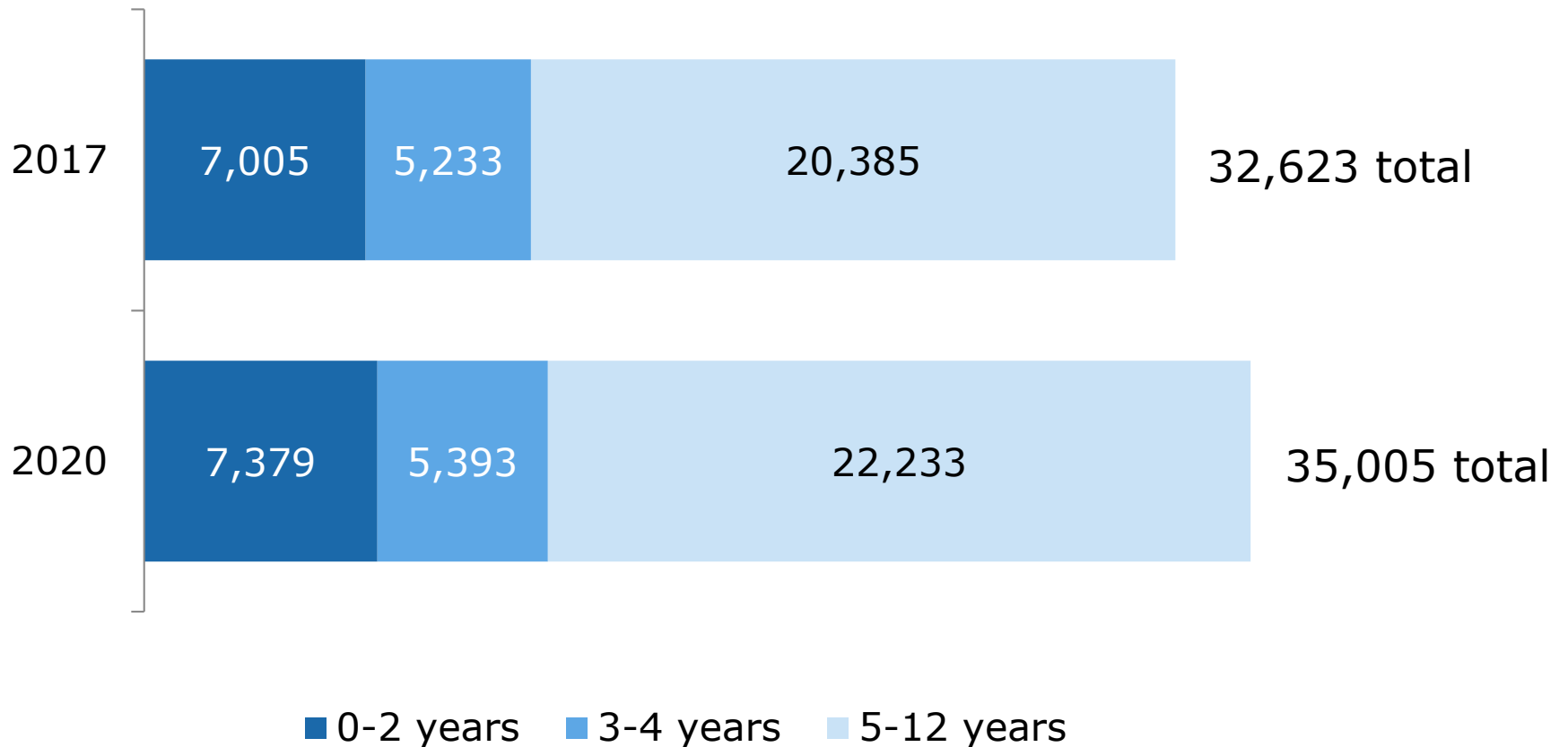

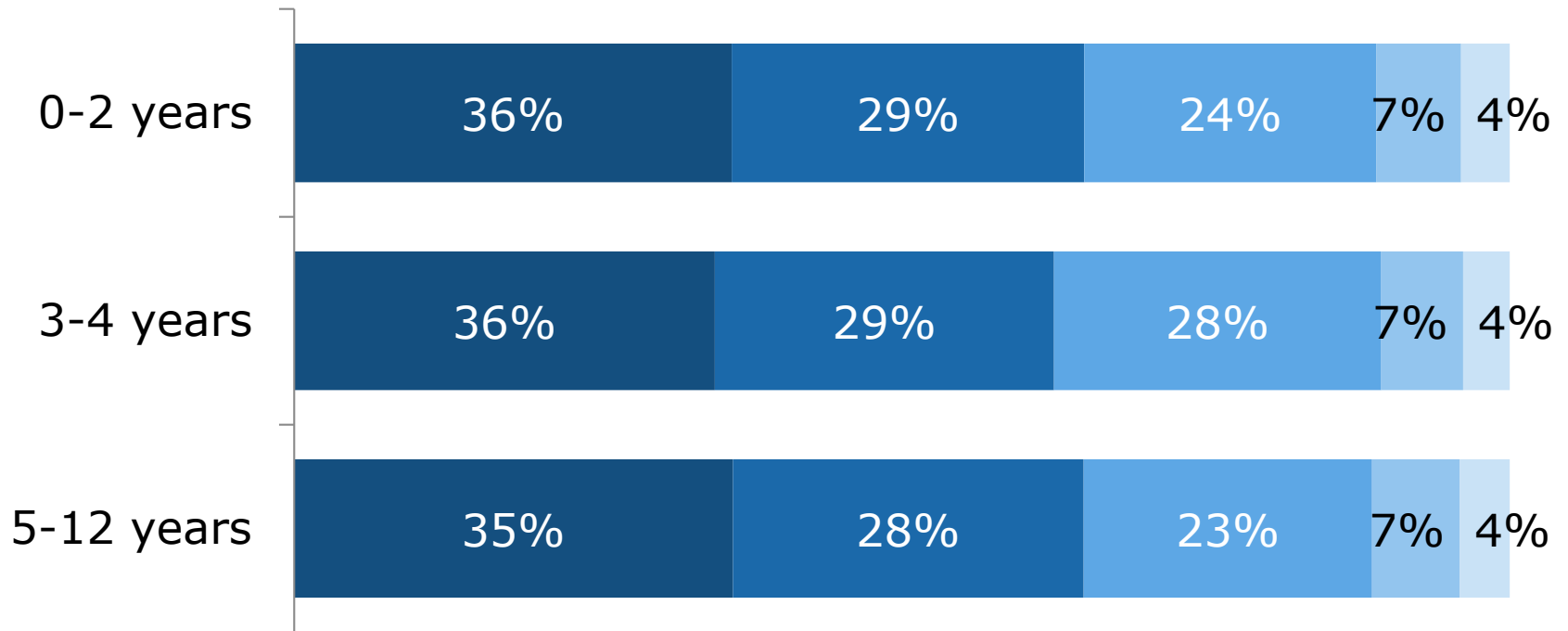

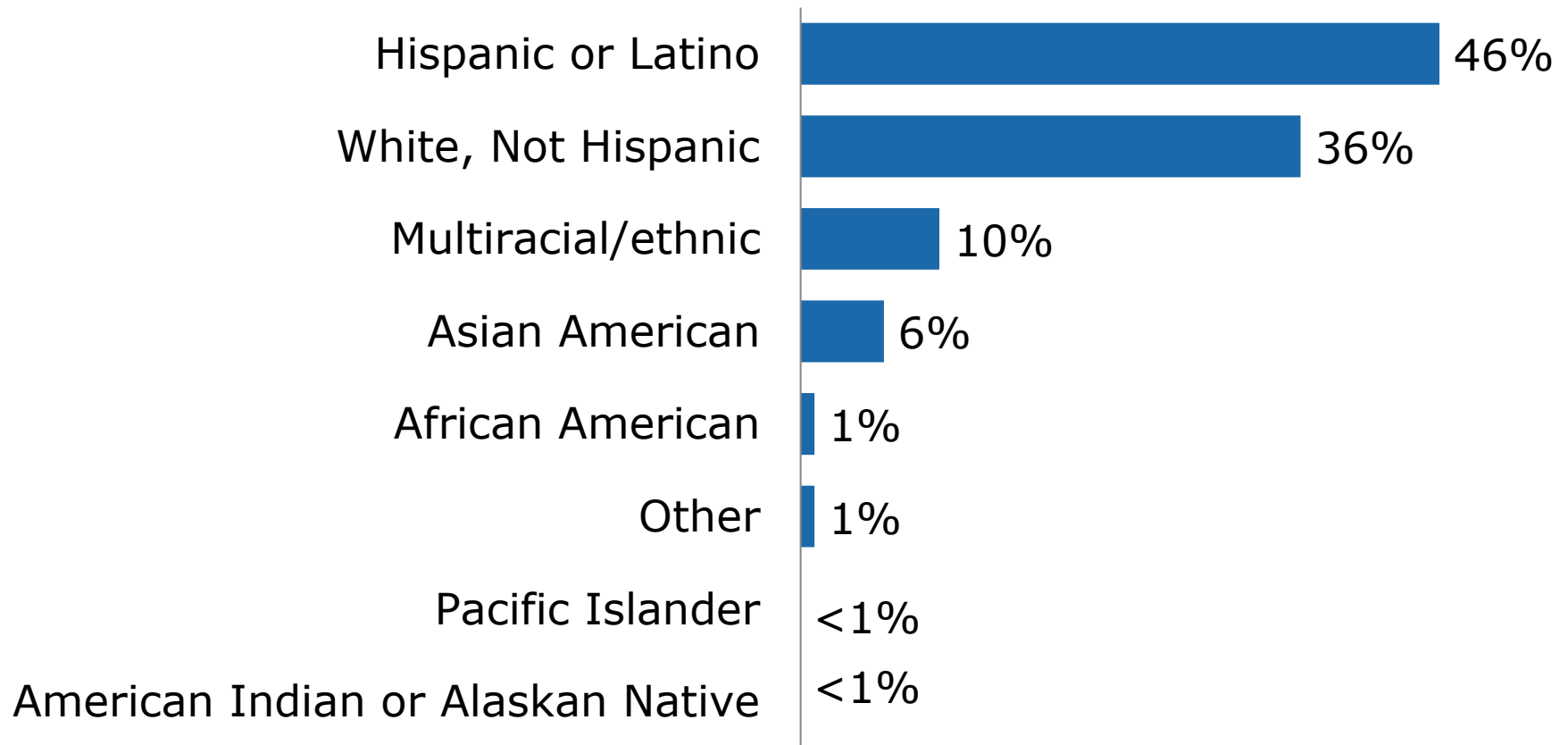
Child Population by Age and City

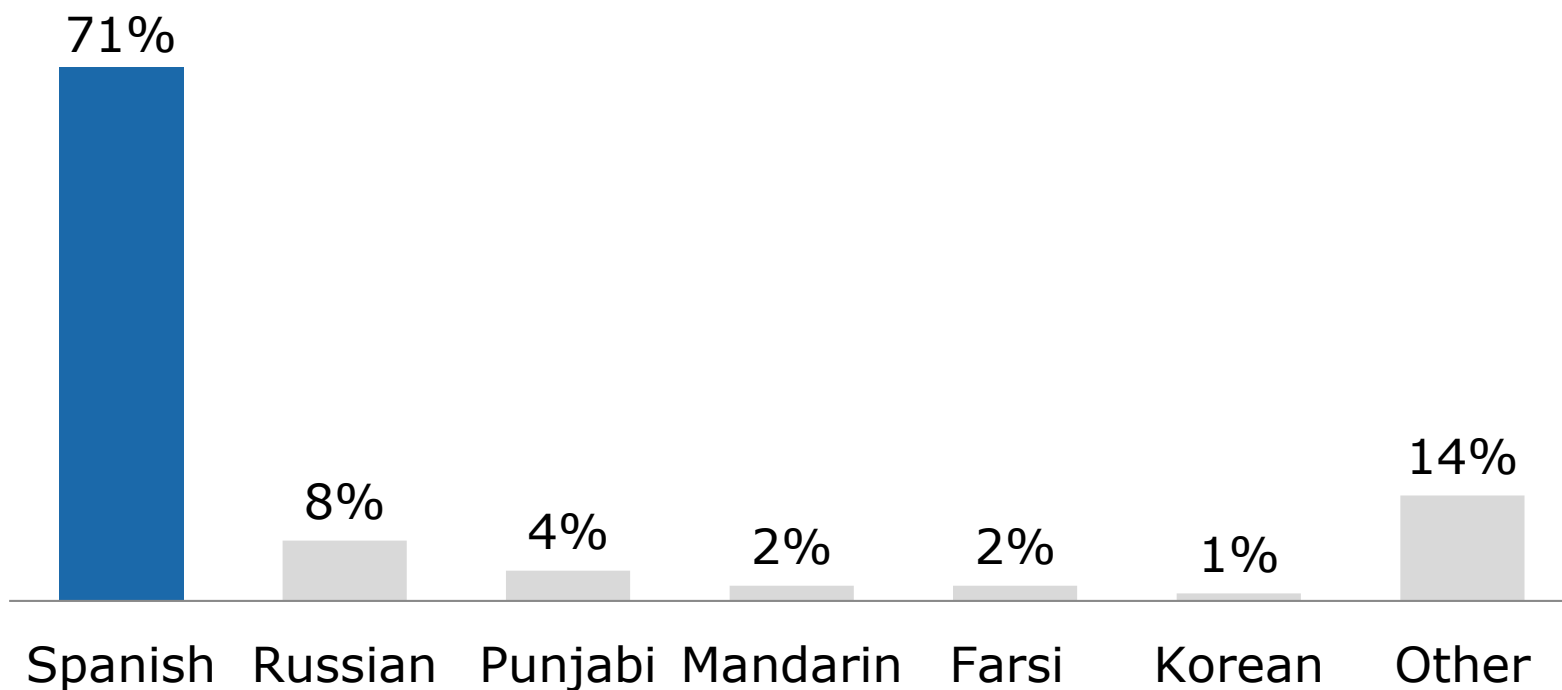

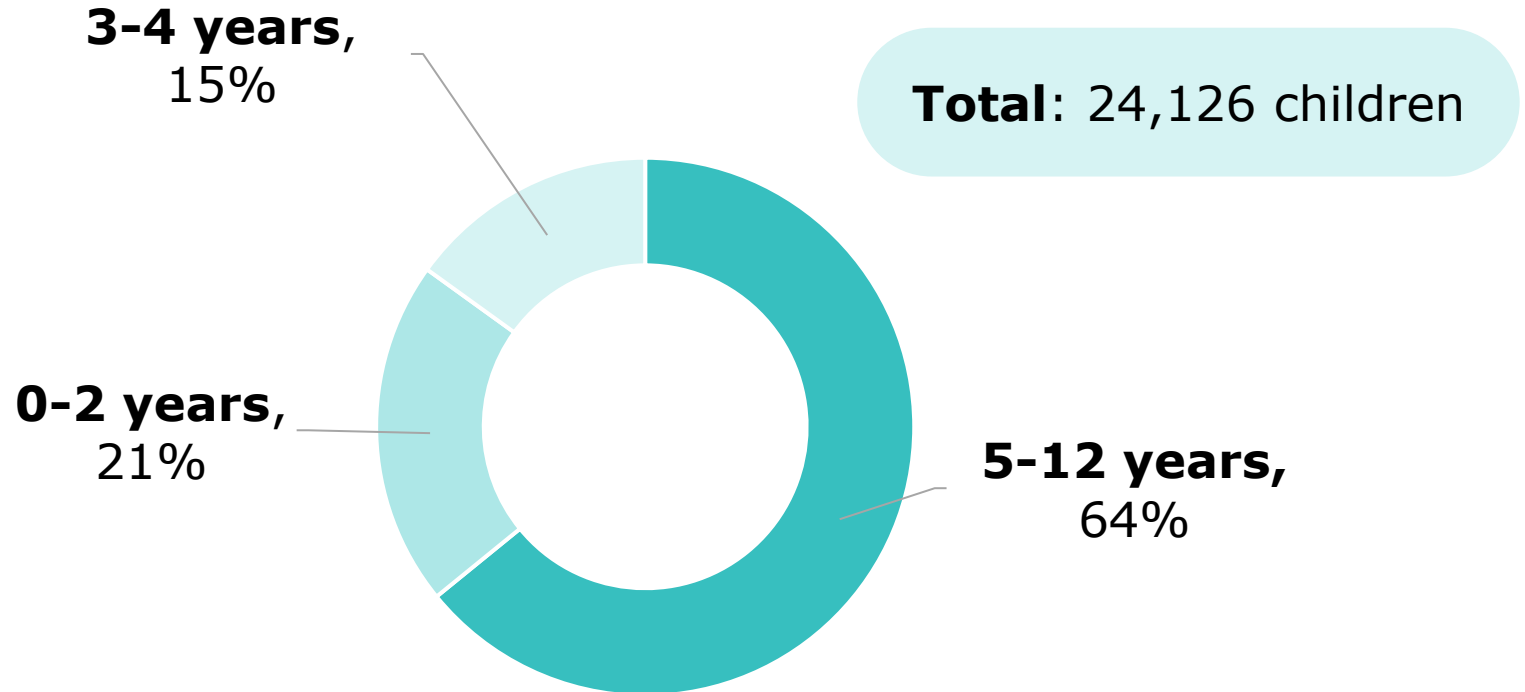

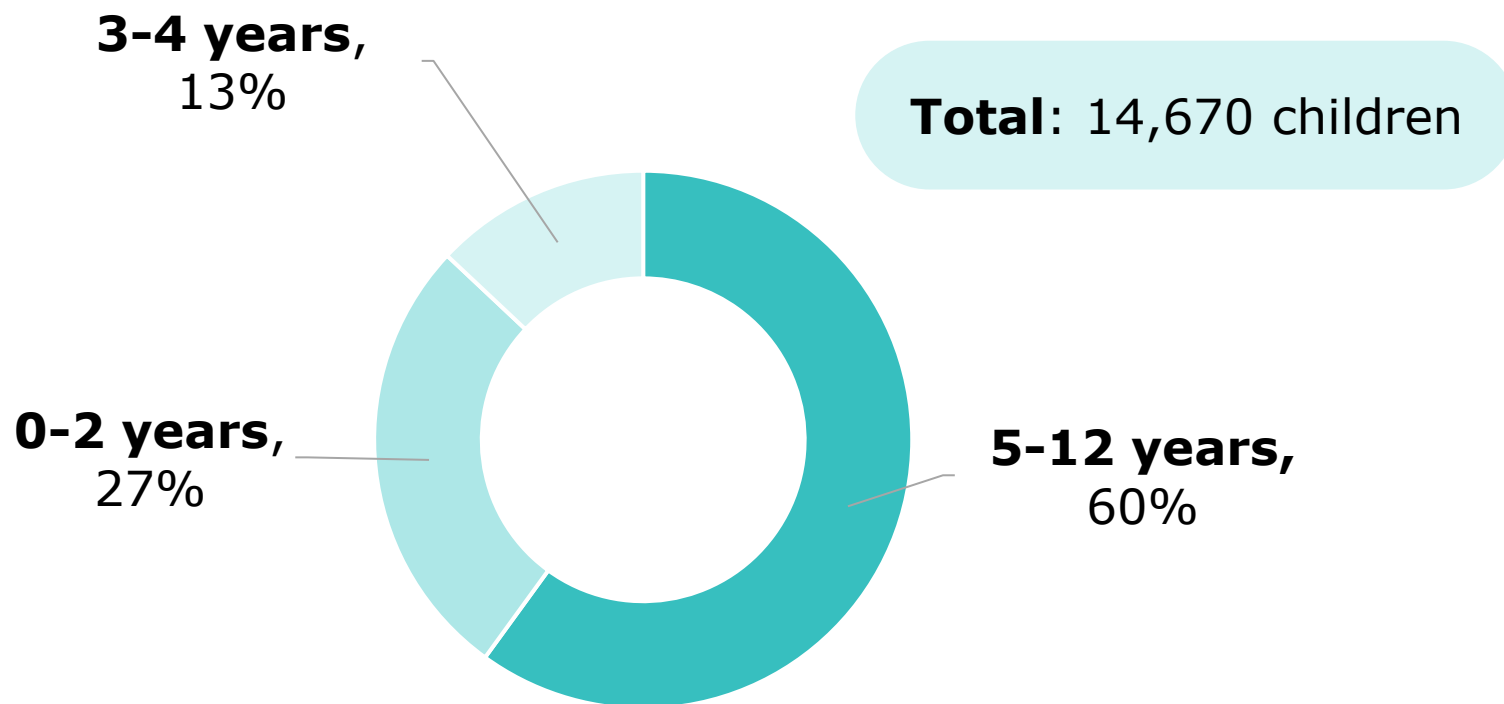

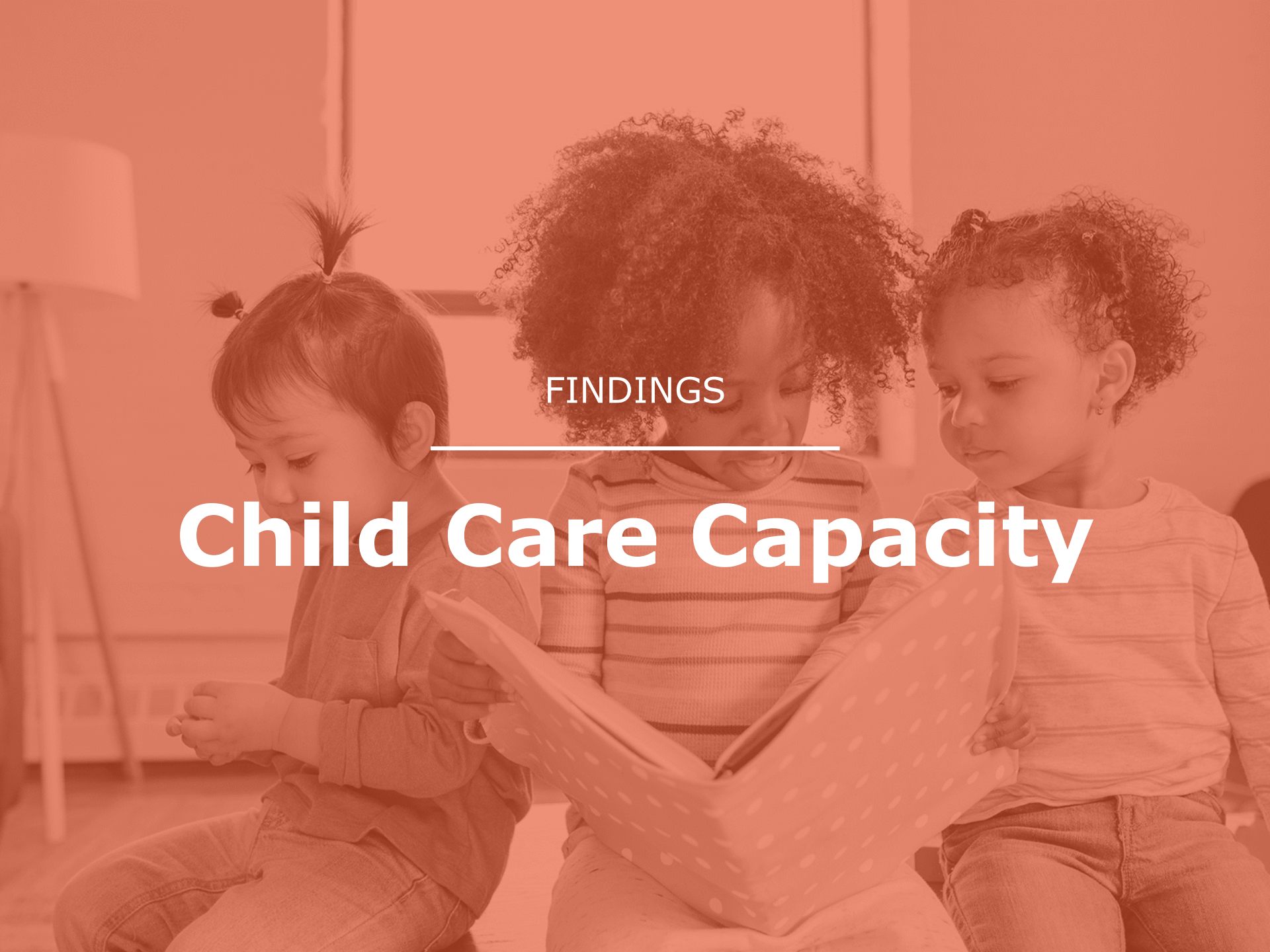
*Percent of Children With **All Parents in the Workforce**

At or Below 85% State Median Income, by Age Group*



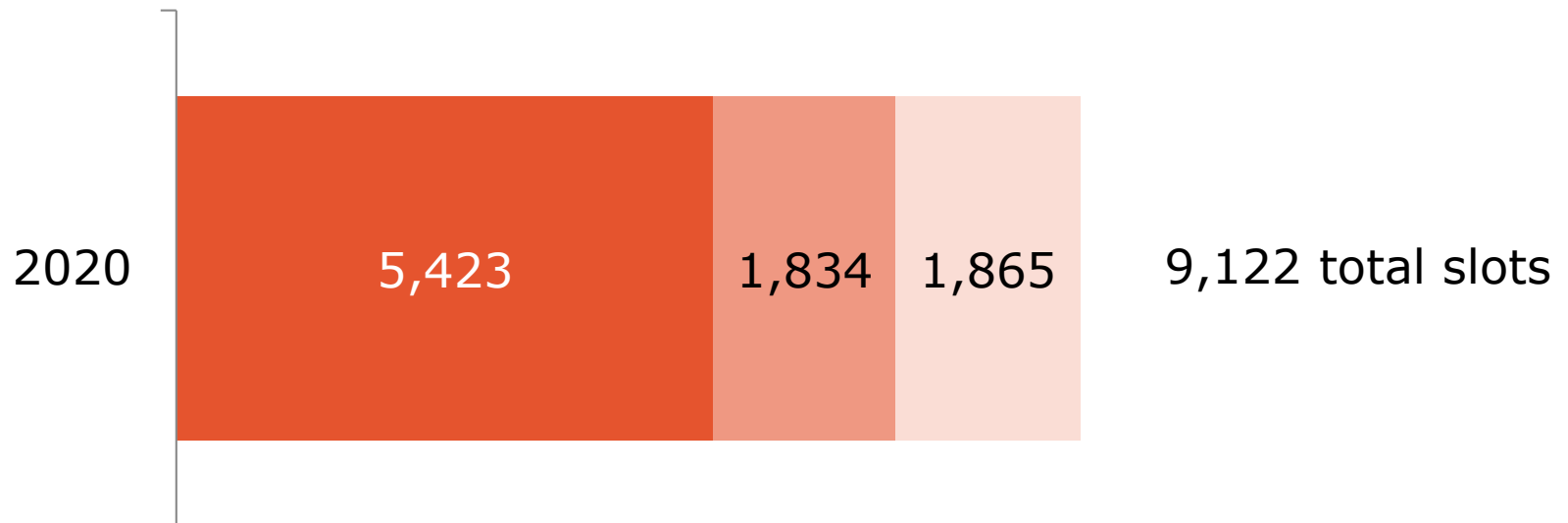

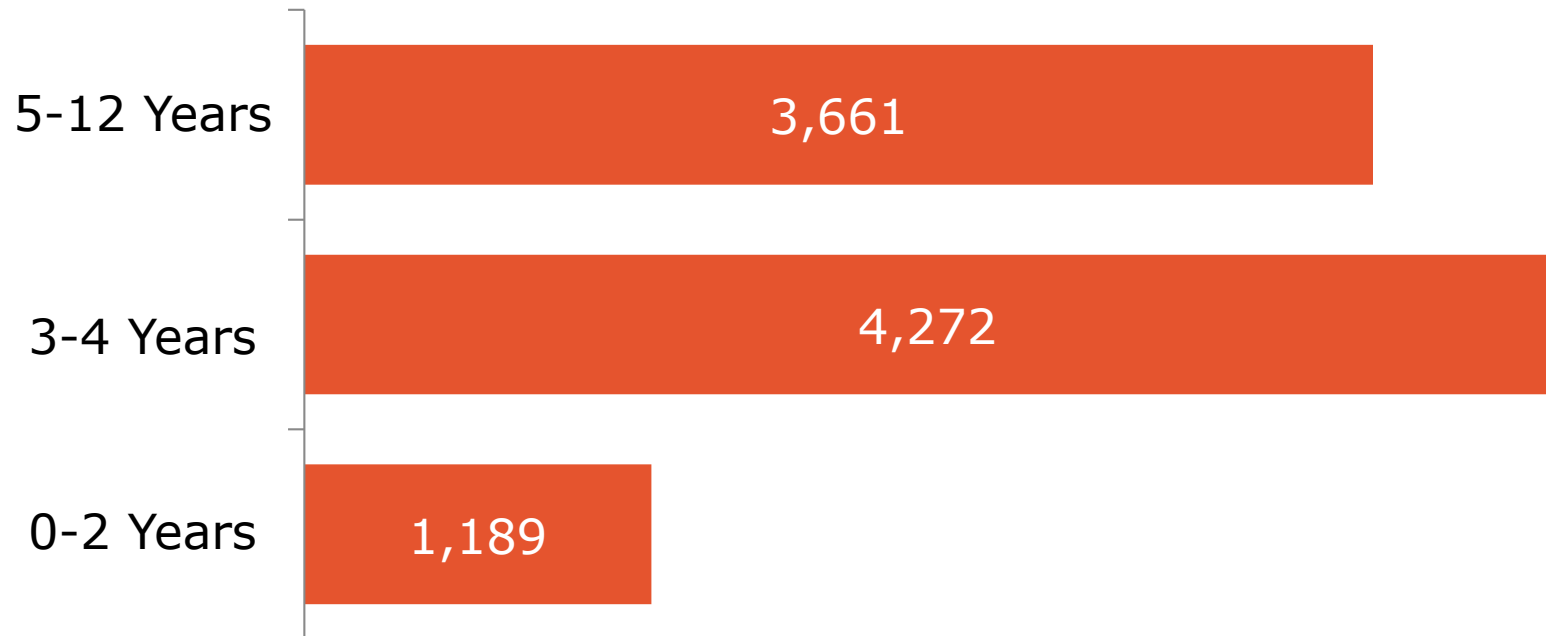
Child Care Spaces in Yolo County by Type of Care

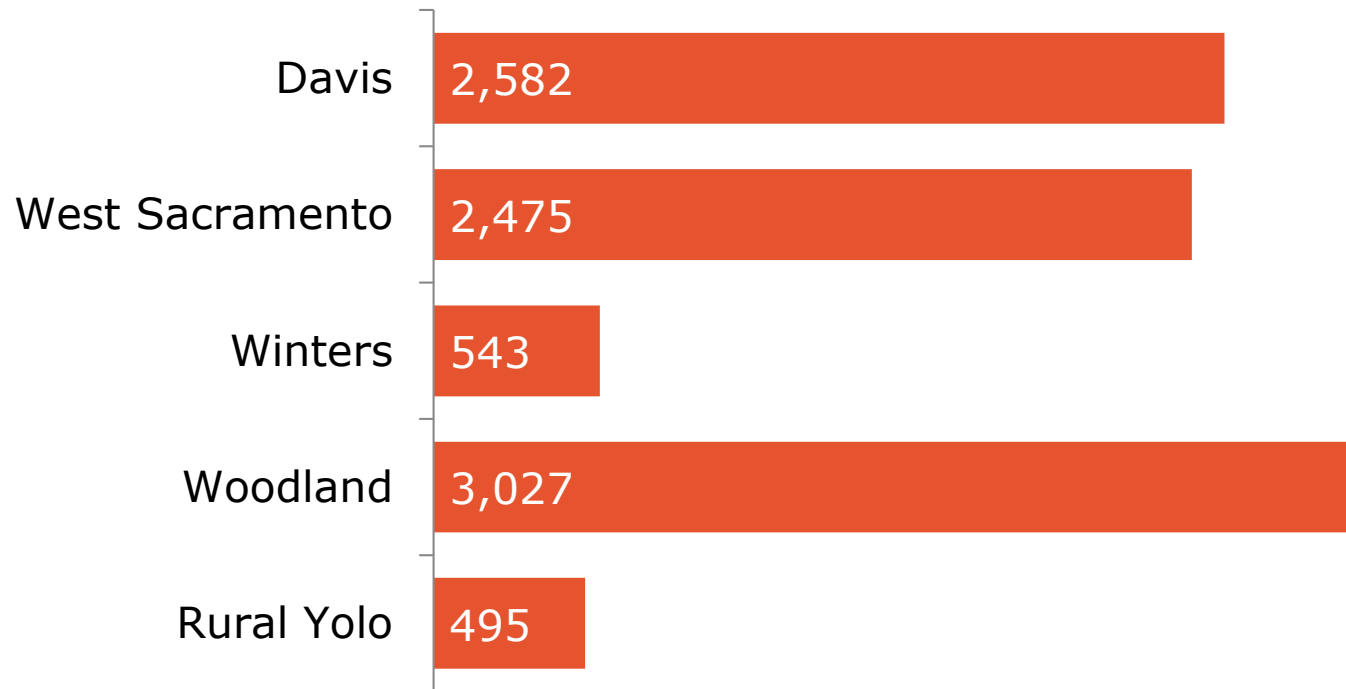

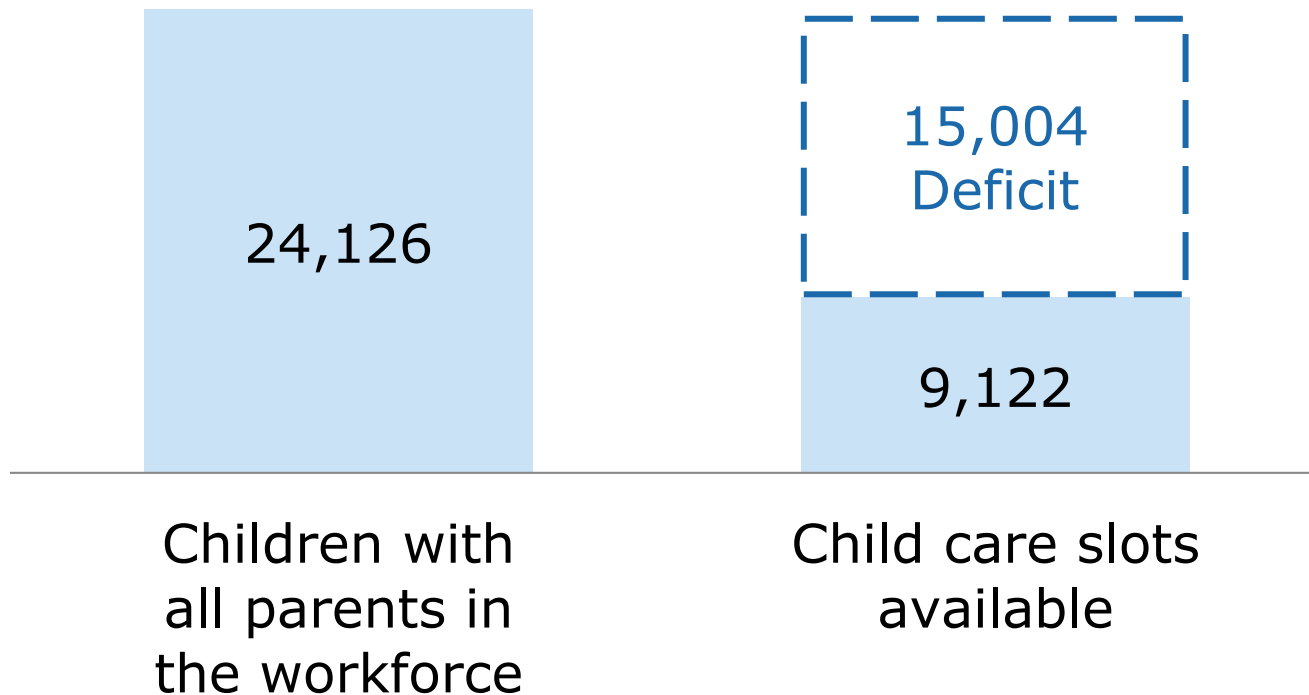

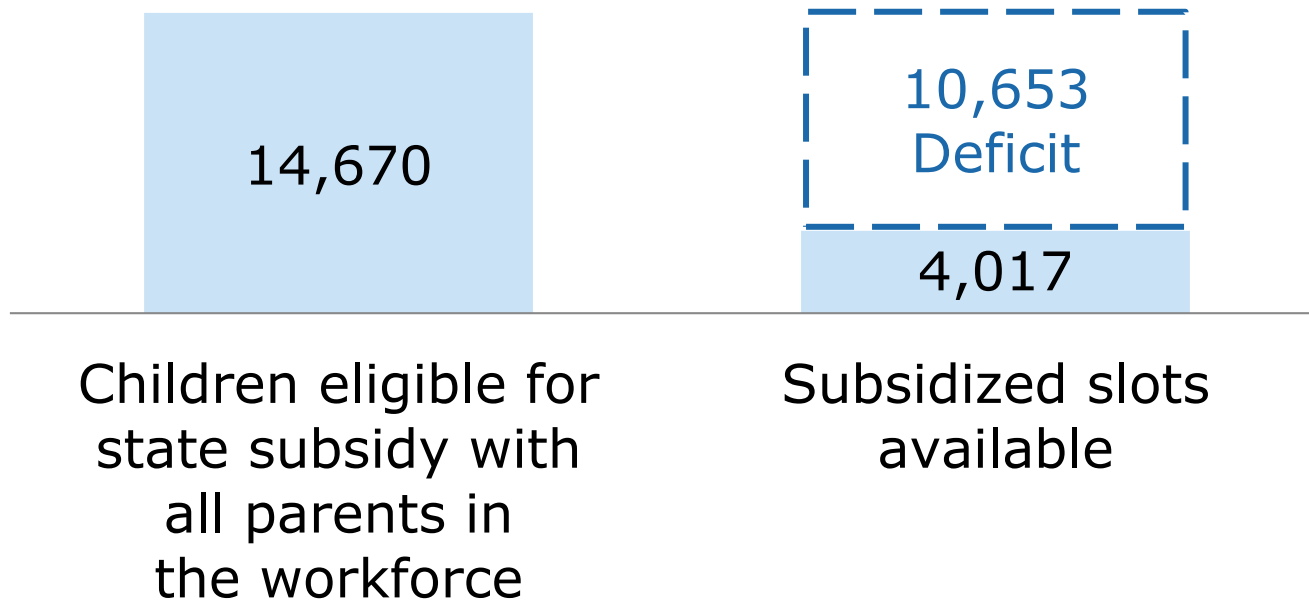

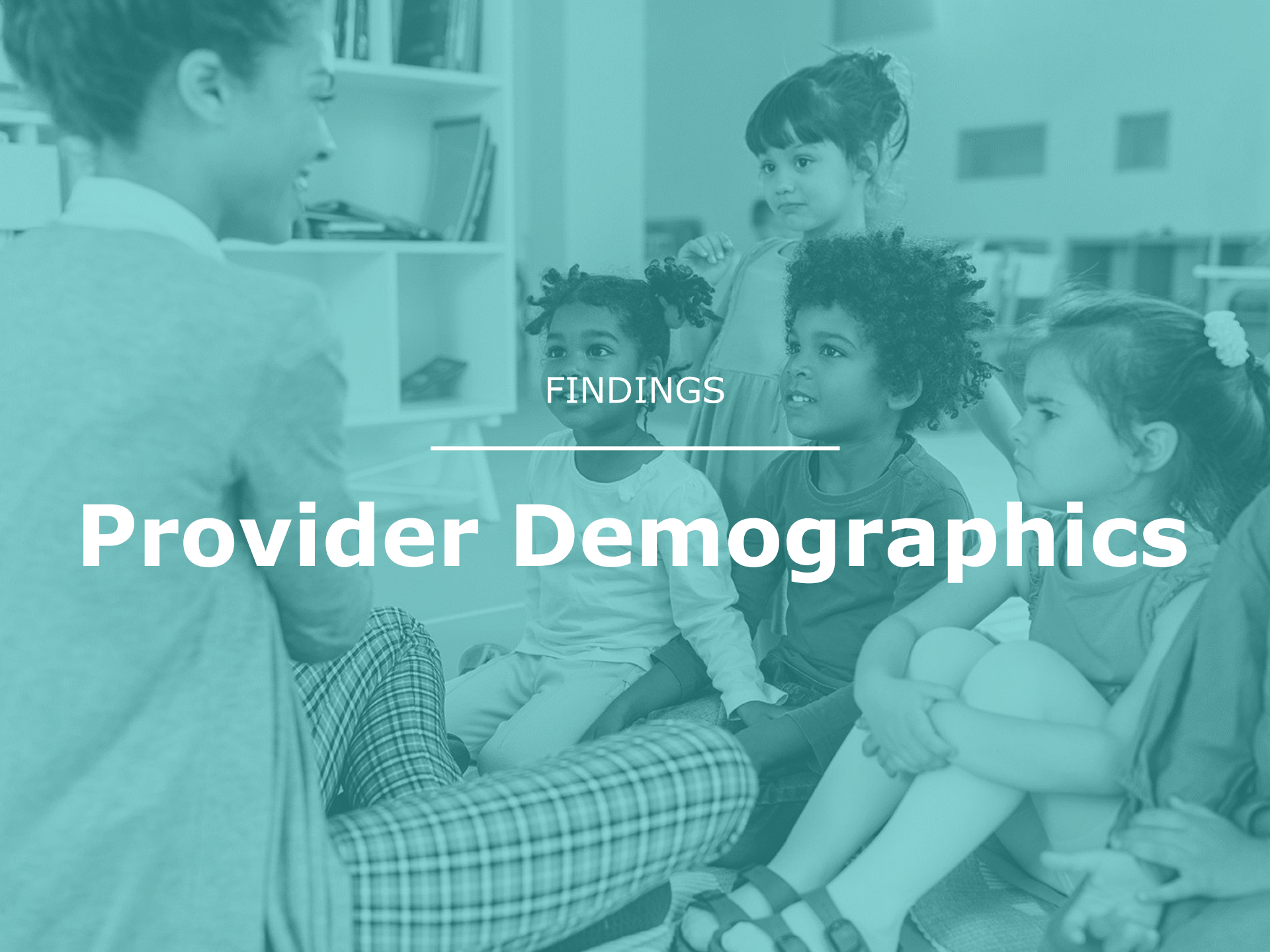

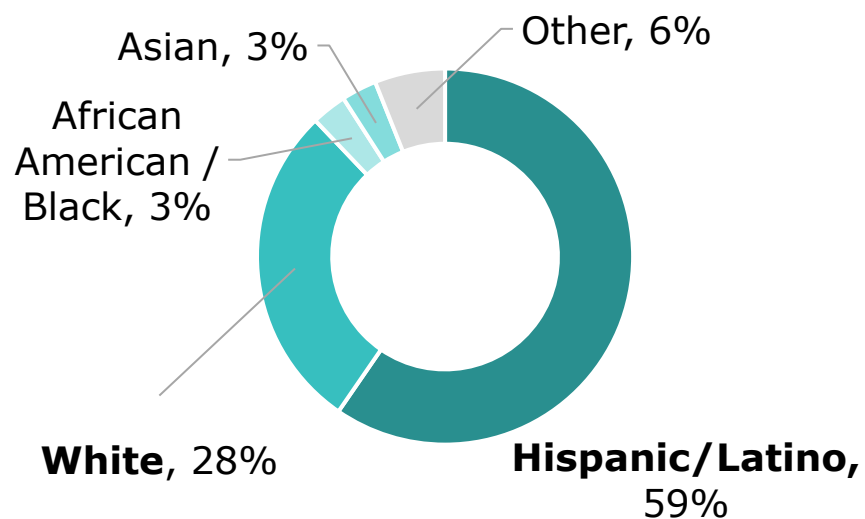

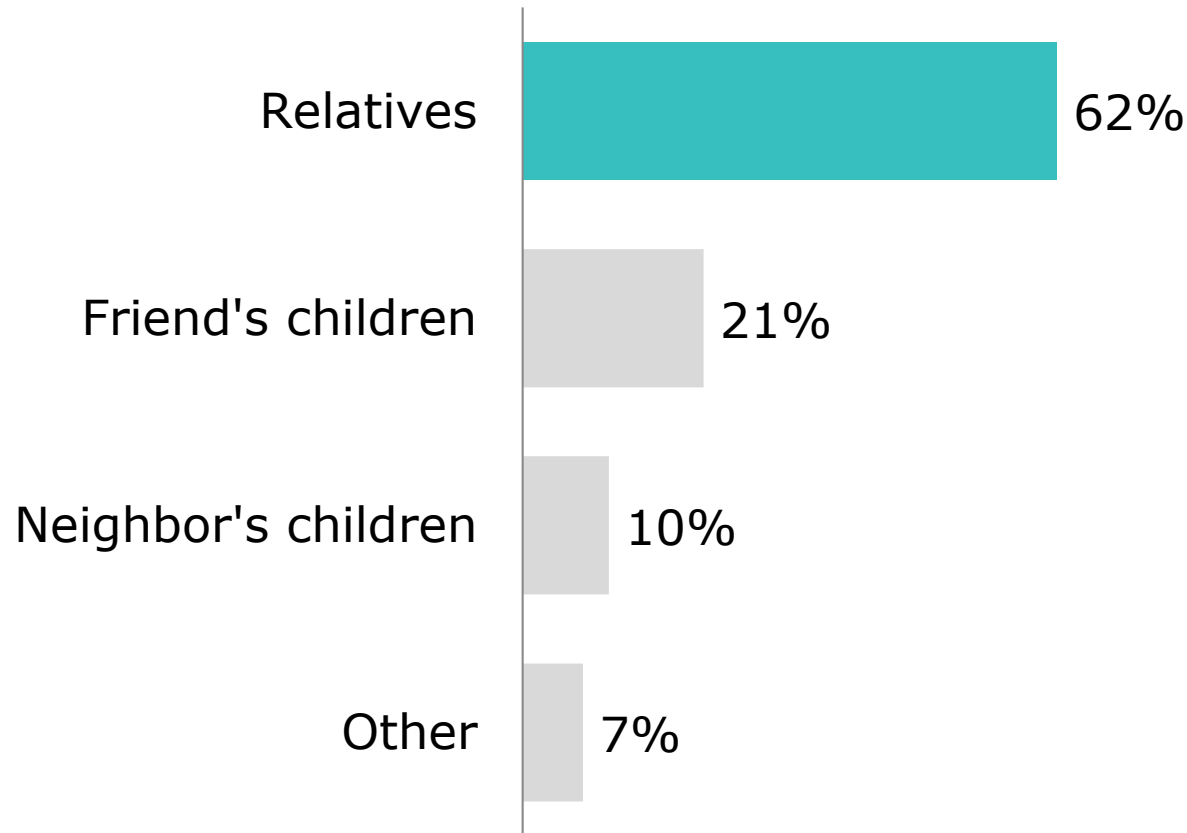

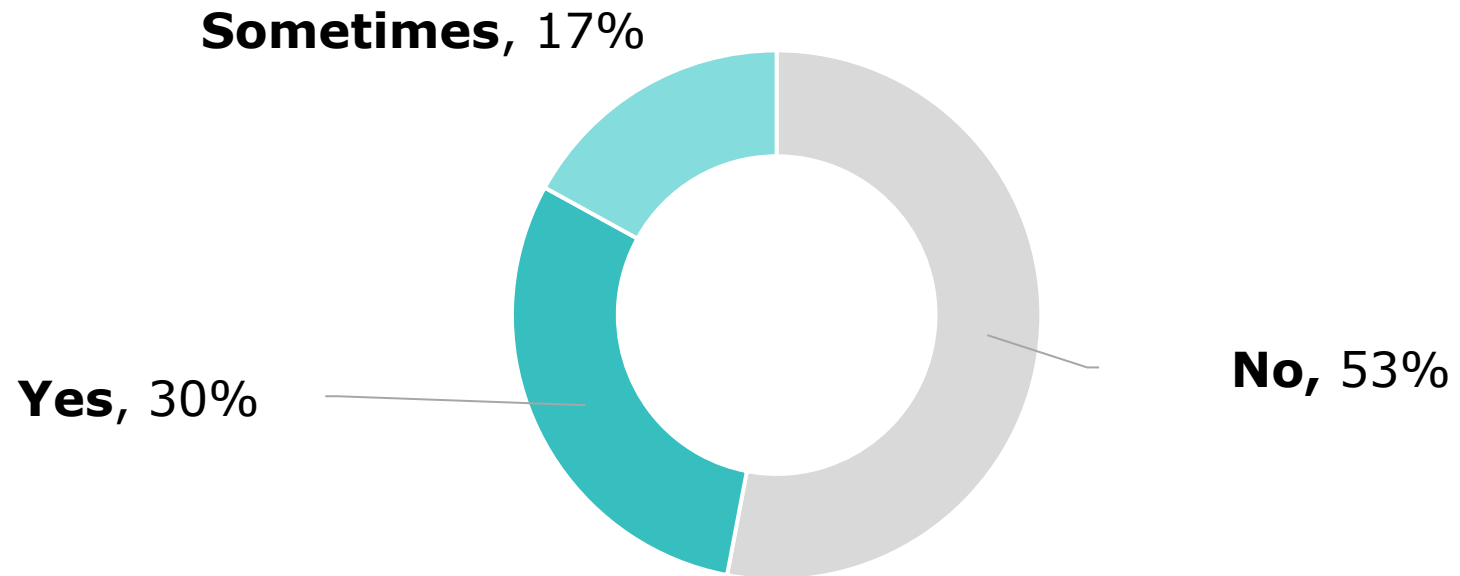

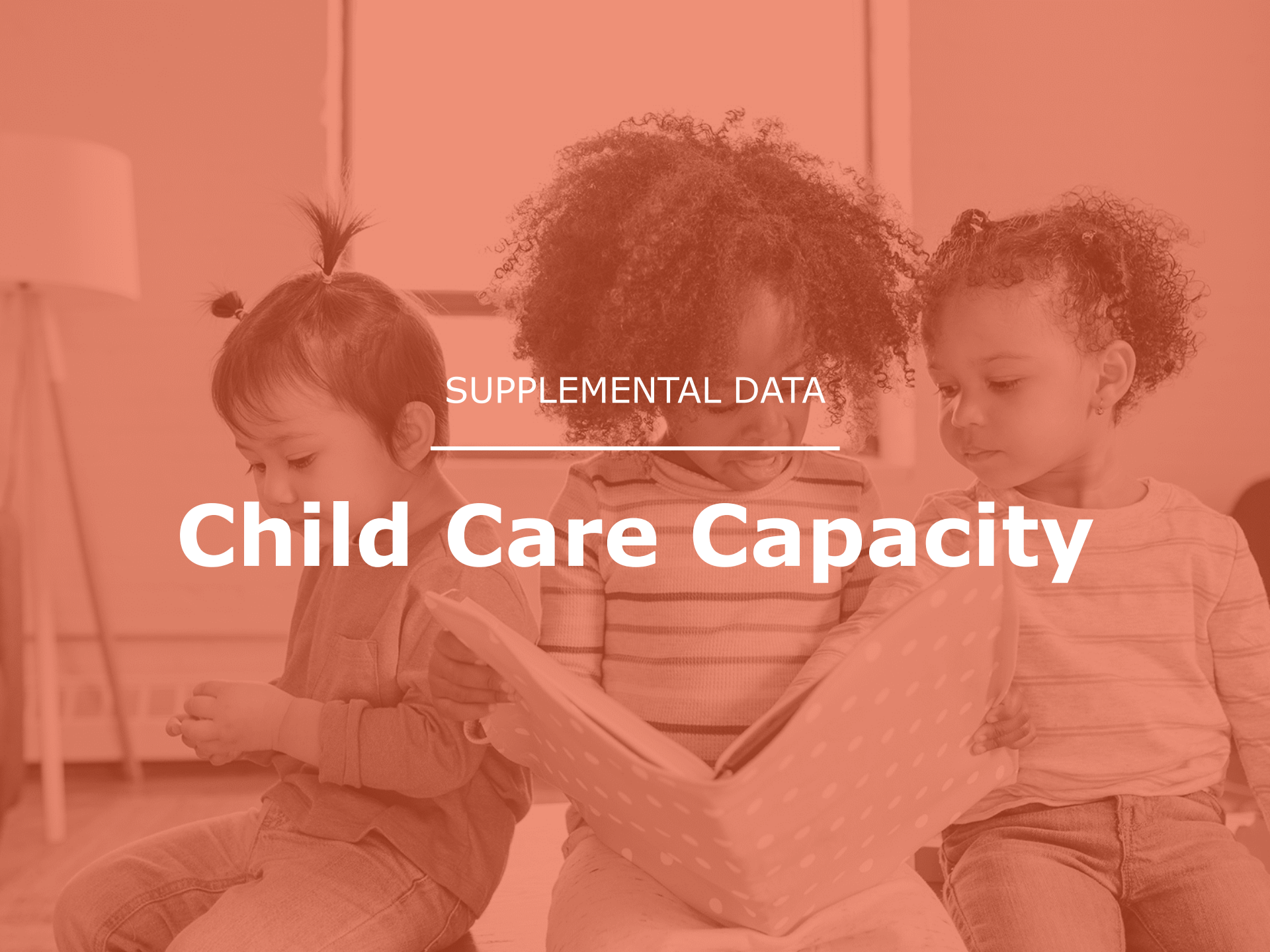
